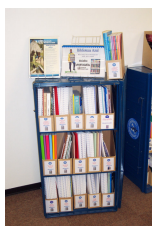

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CPLP Health and Human Resources Seminar: Contributions for a decade of development

The Health and Human Resources Seminar took place in Lisbon during July 10-12. It was attended by various experts within the field of Human Resources, as well as representatives from almost all country members of the Community of Portuguese Speaking Countries (CPLP). Future plans of cooperation amongst the CPLP members and ways to expand the HRH Observatory were discussed, including various ways to train health personal.
